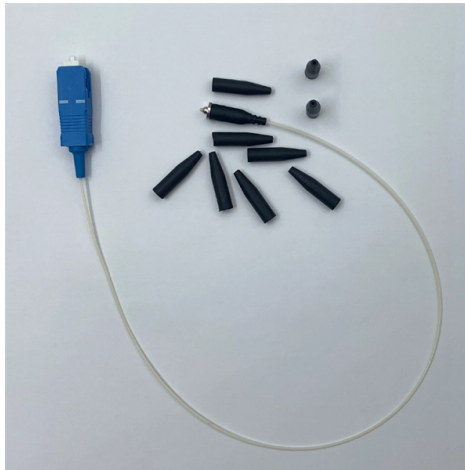


Cable sheath quota for horizontal cable trays



Overview

The NEC requires that cable trays must be supported by members at an interval specified by the cable tray manufacturer, but not more than 5 feet for horizontal runs to support the weight of the cables and other loads. The NEC has a requirement for ladder-type cable trays. For runs at an angle of 30 Degrees or less from the vertical, the vertical spacing is applicable. 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In these conditions, the maximum size of the cable tray in a horizontal run must remain less than 1/200th of the total distance.

Cable ladders and cable trays should be mounted far enough off the floor or roof to allow the cables to exit through the bottom of the cable ladder or cable tray.
