

Can the A and B ends of a single-mode fiber optic transceiver be used interchangeably

Fiber polarity is the direction that light signals travel from one end of a fiber optic cable (link) to the other. Although it may seem obvious, fiber optic polarity is a frequent source of confusion and.
