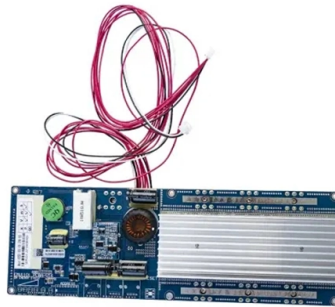


How far should the cable tray tee be placed to add a support



Overview

The NEC requires that cable trays must be supported by members at an interval specified by the cable tray manufacturer, but not more than 5 feet for horizontal runs to support the weight of the cables and other loads. The NEC has a requirement for ladder-type cable trays. Cable ladder systems and cable tray systems shall be manufactured in accordance with BS EN 61537, channel support. All tray items whether stored outside or indoors, should be placed on sufficient dunnage to enable future mechanical lifting. Trays and fittings should be stacked by their physical dimensions (width) and type. All material finishes are prone to storage stain if they are improperly stored outdoors.
