

How many meters should the base station cable tray be fixed



Overview

For vertical cable tray runs, supports should be fixed to the building structure with a spacing preferably less than 2 meters. Properly securing cables within the trays is crucial for organization and safety. It also helps reduce the risk of. The NEC requires that cable trays must be supported by members at an interval specified by the cable tray manufacturer, but not more than 5 feet for horizontal runs to support the weight of the cables and other loads. The NEC has a requirement for ladder-type cable trays. Clause 522-08-04 Where conductors or cables are not supported.
